Principal Report:

- LAND trust Council Membership Report:
 - First goal: Remains the same. Implementing by using \$25,000 set aside from \$58,000 for academic study skills class, \$20,000 for teacher, \$5000 set aside for materials for the class. Extra will go to training. Teacher would like to see us head to being an AVID school, which teaches kids to be more organized, etc.
 - Second goal: \$5000 set aside to assess core classes, standards-based-grading is part of this also, which continues to be refined
 - Third Goal: Special Education students have IEP that go along with their needs. Really
 not a format or system in place to help students achieve goals. Putting together
 professional development for them \$2000 to meet with district person to help develop
 a new system to help with dynamic learning \$8000 for tools that the students may need.

 - Absenteeism: Trying to improve by 10%.
 - Each month have attendance meeting for those meeting. Have a meeting with parents at 10th absence. Letters sent home at 3rd and 6th. Home visits by principal or Vice if necessary. Want to show impact of being absent.
 - Our big problem is 1st period. Mr. Kunkle is meeting with the students regularly
 missing first period and helping by setting small rewards and handing out alarm
 clocks. Seeing slow improvement.
 - First-to-first award where they get awarded for perfect attendance and no tardies.
 - Giving a one-minute bell/warning
 - Improve proficiency of our students of color in academic success: teachers write u a student learning objective for each content area, so students can see success and move forward
 - Continue with IEPs

- Complete council responsibilities regarding Safe Technology and Digital Citizenship
 requirements: Net Smart assembly is tomorrow: internet safety. Would love to see more on
 cyber-bullying. Counselors do touch on it. Administration has had to be very blunt with what is
